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

We entered 2021-22 having a plan to contributing a significant role in the 17 Sustainable Development Goals. (SDGs) This is one of the most pressing yet exciting challenges today's world is facing today after the Pandemic-19 situation. For the first time in last 100 years the world is facing numbers of challenges and trying to overcome it in a strategic manner and KKF sets it's plan accordingly to contribute the maximum in this regard as per its capacity.

KKF is increasingly at the forefront of this movement. Established in 2018, for the ultra poor approach targets households left behind by economic growth or mainstream development interventions we started numbers of new programs named **Swanirbhor**-a interest free loan, Program for the vulnerable **Shufola**–Sustainable Livelihoods for the improvement of destitute farmers, **U-turn**– for the population who are involved in unsocial vulnerable profession and so on.

The program models are developed in such a way that it supports them towards building sustainable livelihoods through a powerful combination of asset transfer, enterprise training, financial services, healthcare, mentoring and social integration.

G Together towards Sustainable Development and Bright Future **1**

Last year through our programs we have reached more than **1,750** families and approximately **246,857** people and for this year also targeting more.

Our all the program initiatives comprises advocacy efforts and technical assistance on how to adapt and implement the approach effectively, in different environments integrated through our capacity development program. Our development programs are funded partly from internally-generated revenue and mostly grants received from internal sources. And for this I am ever grateful to all of our individual donors.

Our home-grown solutions in education, health, financial support for the poorest and other development areas now reach all over the countries. This year we conducted our food program in all the **64** districts of Bangladesh during the month of Ramzan.

Round the year we also served and provided all kind of basic facilities to **1200** distressed children through our

Joy Shokol Shishur program. Round the year provided health care facilities and medical camps in different part of Dhaka City and different districts in Bangladesh.

We have never faced bigger challenges like this but I truly believe that, as a community, we have never been more equipped, more connected or more ready to face them. I am filled with a genuine feeling of hope as we look ahead into 2022-23. I look forward to sharing the journey with you and thanks and dua for all the KKF team members for their efforts and hard works.

Message from Executive Director

Assalamu alaikum. I am feeling extremly honored and privileged to present the foundation's 2021-2022 Annual Report to all of you. The journey after and during pandemic wasn't an easy one for a new foundation like us. However, with the help of our dedicated team and supportive donor's effective moving forward was a bit easier.

This year foundation started number of exceptional program which wasn't implemented before by any other organization in home and abroad. The pilot program was a very successful one, so foundation expanded the program accordingly. Let me update you all about our few signature project of 2021-2022

Let's begin with Project U-Turn a research it was found that only in Dhaka city numbers of floating sexworkers are more than 30 thousand. Majority of them are either forced or trapped. Lack of opportunity and social stigma if they want to live a normal life, society doesn't allow or permit them to do so. For the first time in the history of Bangladesh KKF implemented a program for these disadvantaged group named Project U-Turn. Under this program foundation rehabilitate the sexworkers who want ot move from profession and want to start life in a new way. Foundation through sustainable capacity development training enhance their skill and as per their quality and choice either arrange job or help them to start a business. Till date we rehabilitated 40 women from their previous profession along with training and job allocation. Foundation also provides complete facilities for their child/children through its Joy Shokol Shishur program. Their children received safe shelter, nutrious food, education facilites and other relevant services from the shelter house program.

Project **Swanirbhor** is another milestone for us. For the first time in the history of Bangladesh development organization is providing interest free loan among the beneficiaries through its **Qard-e-Hasanah**, **Shufola**, Project **Unnoyon** and Project **Swanirbhor**. After the success of the pilot project of these programs foundation invested for more **40** participants in **Swanirbhor** and **370** farmers under **Shufola** and Project **Unnoyon**.

Through **Swapner Hut** program we enhance the capacity of underprivileged children on how to make crafts, paintings, home decor items and so on professionally. From the online **Swapner Hut** platform they are also learning basic photography, editing, illustrations and enriching their creative writing skill to sell the products. **Swapner Hut** food creating income generating opportunities for the talented home makers who are excellent in cooking and making home made pickels or sweets. Foundation is creating a market for these group as well through its **Swapner Hut** platform.

To ensure nationwide safe drinking water for all, through our **Mayeen** Project, foundation set number of double layer platform tubewells in the remotest char areas of Bangladesh and number of reservoirs in the hill tract areas of Bangladesh. For safe motherhood and hygiene delivery in the remotest part of the country, Foundation started its first training/workshop in **Erendabari, Jamalpur**. The name of the project is **'Safe Motherhood- Right not Need'**. Under this project foundation is providing training to the local midwives effectively and efficiently.

This year with the support of its donors in the month of Ramadan we provided hot meals among **182500** people in all **64** districts of Bangladesh.

Step by Step Moving towards Exceptional Achievements and Success 77

Round the year Foundation provided safe shelters, food and other basic need facilites to more than **1500** under privilleged children. More than **700** children received formal, non formal and pre-school facilities from foundation.

Our humanitarian response team is promt to respond any disasters. We provided facilities through number of campaigns and **Winter Drive** is one of them. We provided donation to Pirganj fire victims and also organized medical camps for flood affected people along with relief.

Our **Covid Registration** for the distressed slum people received praise from different level. In slum areas earlier the covid registration facilities were not available and foundation in his regard gave door to door service to complete the registration procedure along with follow up.

Step by step we are moving towards success and working to reach our destination. I am grateful to all our donors, honorable board members and special thanks to my **KKF Team** for their utmost help, support and co-operation.




KFoundation




Vision

Who are we?

'Joy Shokol Shishur' blessing home is a registered shelter home – an initiative of KK Foundation which has been founded to aid in rescuing children from situations of abuse, homelessness or severe neglect. We do this by giving residential care, supporting education, medicine and opportunities for self-sufficiency and dignity.


The home started its journey in November 2018 by Arch Mazherul Qader, a philanthropic social worker, to protect and heal children victimized by neglect, exploitation and homelessness; also from the abusive and uncaring environment of the slums of Dhaka and poverty stricken villages beyond. We believe this program makes a big difference in these young lives.

The journey began with three children since November 2018 and now it is providing shelter to more than 75 distressed children. The home is equipped with good facilities and proper supervision ensuring that every child can look forward to a better future. Well trained staff and caretakers look after the children with love, warmth, security, and stability that only a home can provide.

Non Formal Education

Background

For the betterment of the underprivileged children, foundation has a long-term plan to start school for them. As a part of the activities, with the help of relevant field advisors and academics, foundation has prepared book for the early childhood development program.

Initially, it has a plan to implement the program for the early birds of Joy Shokol Shishur Program with close monitoring and supervision. After observing and learning from the result of the first batch, from next year Foundation has a plan to expand its program nationwide.

Inauguration of KKF Non- Formal Education

At the non-governmental level, KKF has a plan to participate as non-formal education service provider in Bangladesh to contribute and create a direct impact on SDG 4 directly. As a part of that foundation introduced two non-formal education program from March 2022.

Early Childhood Development offers a center-based learning for two years plus children.

The curriculum is fully play based that serves early learning stimulation. **Pre-Primary School** where a teacher and 5+ years old children will learn in a friendly and



playing environment. The journey started with 15 students who are currently living under foundation's Joy Shokol Shishur program.

The inauguration of the program was held on March 6, 2022 at the program office of the foundation. Ms. Sifat E Azam, Executive Director inaugurate the program and took the first few weeks classes as a part of the Teaching Pedagogy Practical Session for the teachers.

Early Childhood Program

Under early childhood program, through Montessori Method children are taught though craft making and jolly phonic simultaneously.

Non Formal Education

The assessment of 15 children of non-formal education was held on June 18th and 22nd. The 1st quarter result was published on 28th June and all of them achieved satisfactory result.

FORMAL EDUCATION

Education is one of the basic rights of every person in this world. In line with the National Education Policy 2010, KKF's strategic vision for the next five years ensures inclusion and equitable quality education and promotes lifelong opportunities for all (SDG 4). In Bangladesh, there are many children who are deprived of education in both rural and urban areas. **K**KF is working on providing both formal and non-formal education to underprivileged children in the country. The aim of this program is to ensure the right to education for the deprived children.

Moreover, there are a number of schools all around Bangladesh that are receiving donation from the foundation. At present, 60 students are receiving monthly financial support for their formal education from us.







Everyone on the Planet deserve to have access to clean and safe drinking water. More than 665 million people in the earth live without it. In Bangladesh as per UNICEF Repeat 2018 only 34.6% population have the access to save drinking and clean water. Foundation wants to take an initiatives to contribute and change the situation in this regard creating it's population in the SDG 6 goal.

O⁺ Mission

The Mission of this project is to ensure clean and safe drinking water to people of Bangladesh especially for the people of remotest and difficult of the country.

Implementation Plan

KK Foundation doesn't focus only on the numbers of people they are focusing on the numbers of people we are serving rather than the effective use it. Considering the issue in 2019 foundation launched a program named "Mayeen"- means **Fresh Water Stream**, to help the community through impactful, innovative and sustainable manners.

We are providing the facilities through "MAP" Framework Model which implies-





The reason behind choosing this framework because when Foundation look at these five indicators together, not only it helps to understand the impact of the existing work but also helps to improve the approaches for future water projects.

MAP Framework

This is a comprehensive Framework and before investing the money the program measures five different components

- How much did the efforts improve access to clean water?
- Did the work foundation funds improve the quality of water people are drinking?
- Are more people able and willing to use a clean water and safe latrine?
- Did the efforts successfully encourage families to practice good hygiene and hand washing?
- Is there a system in place to manage water, sanitation & hygiene?

Water, Sanitation and Hygiene

When foundation fund a clean water project the work is not done when the water arrives. Local communities are also trained on the importance of sanitation and hygiene, because e improving an access to water, sanitation, and hygiene all together can prevent more than 1,000 deaths of children under five every single day. (UNICEF/WHO2015)

Diverse Solutions

Bringing clean water to people looks different in each location water sources, terrain, and population all play a part in determining what technology is required to serve people well. To meet the needs of each community KKF serves, implement different technologies in different places-including drilled wells, rainwater catchments double platform and more.

An Emphasis on Remote and Rural

Nearly 65% population who don't have access to clean water live in rural and remote areas of Bangladesh. So we focus our work on the hardest-to-reach parts of the country, where the need for clean water is greatest.

Invest in Local Partners

Whenever we fund a project, we partner with carefully-chosen local experts. Every partner we work with has a community-centered approach, excellent reporting practices, and a deep knowledge of effective, sustainable water project implementation in their area. When the project began we made a bold promise that 100% of public donations would go to funding project Mayeen.

Through Project Mayeen Foundation is already providing services to more than 5000 people around the country with clean water. Altogether, with the help of the donors we ensures 8 numbers of water sources till date. We set them in Bharatkhali, Paler Char, Jontir Kanda, Baliapara, Kalapani and Mongla para giving 5000 flood victim and hilly people access to fresh flowing water, every single day.

Impact

Those 5000+ people who no longer rely on contaminated water to quench their thirst

At least **1000** girls who no longer miss school to walk miles for fetching their family's daily water supply.

More than **2,500** children & elderly people who are no longer susceptible to life-threatening water-borne disease, and countless animals who can now stay hydrated and healthy, offering their fresh dairy for consumption.



COUNSELLING

KKF provides a range of counselling services to help the staff as well as the children with psychological pressures and anxiety issues to cultivate positivity and promote sound mental health.

Both privileged and underprivileged groups are the subjects of concern. Underprivileged groups are prone to various hazards and they are victim to many traumatic situations. We offer counselling support for them to cope up with post-traumatic stress. In addition, we provide psychological help such as stress management, conflict management, proper parenting etc. for the public along with our regular program beneficiaries.

Eid Food Distribution among

the Distress

On the occasion of Eid ul Fitr KKF distributed improved lunch among **470** Numbers of distressed people in different parts of Dhaka city.

Sylhet Emergency Flood Relief

1st Phase

As the Surma and the Kushiyara keep rising, more and more areas of Sylhet and Sunamganj are going under water every day and large number of flood victims suffering from scarcity of food and drinking water. As per the dailies around 20 lakh people have been affected by the flash floods in the two districts.

In a joint venture with Give Bangladesh, KKF started its first phase campaign "Fight against Flood" and distributed relief among **300** families on May 23, 2022. The team covered Syedabad, Latargaon, Rabardam, Baishakandi, Mahishapur, Bahadurpur, Sinakandi, and Rahmatpur villages of Islampur Union of Chhatak Upazila and Barbara Primary School, next to Mughalpara Mosque, Hadapandab Bazar.

Each relief package contained 7 kg chira, 1 kg molasses, 10 pieces oral saline, 2 packets biscuits, and water purification tablets.

2nd Phase

Sunamganj Division, Sachna Union, Rahimapur, Arshinagar, Baghati, Horihorpur villages **400** Emergency Rations were distributed.





In Tahirpur, **100** Emergency Ration and 300 cooked food packets were distributed among the flood victims.

3rdPhase

In the third phase of the last emergency response, the relief were distributed to 400 people of Ballabpur on 25 June, 2022 in Chatak. 7 kg rice, 2 kg potatoes, $\frac{1}{2}$ a kg pulse, salt, candles and water purification tablets were included in the package.

Master Md. Rasel is a special residential child of Joy Shokol Shishur Program. This child is receiving the facilities of safe shelter, nutritious balanced diet, health care facilities and relevant services from KKF.

On behalf of Rasel with the help of Bank Asia, foundation has opened a bank account for him and after the completion of all the relevant activities, Rasel received 9000 (nine thousand taka) disable allowance for the first time from Bangladesh Government.

SAFE MOTHERHOOD Right not Need



There is a touch of development in the health sector of Bangladesh, but development has not been yet reached in the majority chars and remotest areas of many districts. In most cases till date complete healthcare facilities are not available in the community clinics. The char areas are the most vulnerable in his regard surrounded with various irregularities. Regarding health services chars of Erendabari, Gaibandha is one of the most notable area which deprived from basic health services. Last three years' foundation has the opportunity to work closely here along with numbers of projects and identified this fact.

Why Erendabari Gaibandha?

As it is very difficult to reach healthcare in Gaibandha's Erendabari Union Char areas, the people here usually deal the maternal delivery activities through incompetent midwives. Since the midwives are not well trained and equipped, in majority cases there is a high risk of bleeding and complications during delivery time. As a result, the lives of both mothers and children who are at serious risk.

Implementation Plan

KKF in a joint collaboration with Give Bangladesh Foundation is implementing its new 6 months based training program named **Project Safe Motherhood-** Right not Need, to reduce maternal and child mortality through trained midwives. The program has been started from April 2022.



Some Facts (UNICEF 2022)



Rational

Growing up in a clean and safe environment is every child's right. Access to clean water, basic toilets, and good hygiene practices not only keeps children thriving, but also gives them a healthier start in life. Despite COVID-19 putting the spotlight on the importance of hand hygiene to prevent the spread of disease, three billion people worldwide, including hundreds of millions of school-going children, do not have access to handwashing facilities with soap. People living in rural areas, urban slums, disaster-prone areas and low-income countries like Bangladesh are the most vulnerable and the most affected.

The consequences of unsafe water, sanitation and hygiene on children can be deadly. Over 700 children under age 5 die every day of diarrhoeal diseases due to lack of appropriate health and sanitation services. Autistic children are nearly 20 times more likely to die from diarrhoeal disease than from the normal children.

Project Nazifa – Personal Health and Hygiene Project for the Underprivileged

Foundation in collaboration with Dhaka North City Corporation, Department of Social Welfare, Ministry of Women and Children Affairs, Kuweit Bangladesh Friendship Government Hospital, Dhaka Ahsania Mission, Uttara Women's Club, Uttara Adhunik Medical College & Hospital, Rashid Foundation, Protibondhi Seba O Sahajjo Kendro, Jatio Protibondhi Foundation, International ASF Legal Aid Foundation. organization started a project since June 2022. The main purpose of the project is to aware and improve the Personal Health and Hygiene Project for the Underprivileged children specially the autistic children of slum areas of Bangladesh.

Background

While aiding out marginalized communities affected by the COVID-19, foundation worked with an organization named 'Bachte Chai', which is operated by an ex-floating sex worker at present who is an activist and working dedicatedly for the struggling mobile sex workers of Dhaka City who want to move from the professional.

Our expertise team immediately formulated a 180-degree plan and launched a project named U-Turn. The main objective of this program is to work with those sex workers who desperately want to move out from the profession and because of the taboo, social circumstances or for the external forces failing to do so and incorporate them with respected livelihoods.

Foundation is giving the priority more to those who have children or who are very new in the profession. It also rehabilitates their children in its Joy Shokol Shishur Program and train the mother in numbers of areas along with job opportunities.

Implementing Plan

Foundation initially conceptualized and planned a campaign of rehabilitating eight floating sex workers and managed a new profession for them, along with keeping their children in a shelter home and taking the full responsibility of their guardianship until they attain the age of maturity.

KKF established a training center equipped with number of tailoring supports and facilities. The package includes sewing training and a particular workplace- for each of them. A professional trainer is training the participants and at the end of the training successful trainee receives job opportunity either in tailoring shop or in garments factories.





- 5 Traditional crop production results low and fixed profit margin





The main objectives of the program is to engage the destitute community of the country whose existence is not accepted by the family still they exist like street children, sew workers, transgender, and so on. Another broader objective is to make it a revolutionary platform and retail industry with high standards for quality and artistry. This iconic brand will be a blend of traditional with the contemporary in a way that never cease to win consumer appeal at both home and abroad.

The foundation acts as Swapner Hut's production hub, where destutes, artisans will be trained as well as find employment and access to many well-being programs such as financial subsidies for health expenditures, access to Qardh e Hasanah and saving instruments, legal aid, daycare for working mothers, awareness on rights and access to government benefits, and so on.

The main motto of the program is 'By the Destitute, For the Destute'

With the help of a few qualitative survey, it was identified that for the betterment of the marginal farmers a comprehensive package of financial help, awareness, training, and social and community development will help them more effectively. As per KKF's impact evaluation results from previous pilot projects in the area, this approach is likely to improve the overall condition of a farmer household in a given community.

Our Beneficiaries

Our beneficiaries are farmers and their households, belonging to both genders, possessing farming lands that are passed down from ancestors or through leasing. Most of our beneficiaries are in heavy debt and repayment is difficult due to high-interest rates (especially when it comes to micro-credits).


Working Areas

Two (2) villages in the river delta of Jamuna River in Gaibandha. Moddho Harichandi has approximately **600** families, and Uttor Harichandi has approximately **550**

families. Nearly every household in the area is involved in agricultural production (crops and livestocks) to make a living.

Considering the availability of the fund initially for one year we have a plan to work with 200 families from both the villages.

On dated 24th February KKF disbursed the fund of its portion to the Executive Director of GUS. On the occasion Ms. Sifat-e-Azam, Executive Director, KK Foundation, Mr. Mannan Akand, Executive Director, Gono Unnoyan Songstha, Mr. Saifullah Mithu, Founder, Give Bangladesh were present.

'A loan without any interest and service charge.'

Swanirbhor is a Bengali word that means self-dependent. Qard e Hasanah is an Arabic word means a benevolent loan. Though all loans in Islam are interest-free and Qard e Hasanah is that interest and collateral-free beautiful loan. The pandemic teaches us a lesson of a lifetime. Foundation from the year 2020 started a program named Folon through which it started helping the destitute farmers with this loan. While working with them it also discovered apart from the farmers there are some other professionals who also need this kind of loan.

In the Islamic community, Muslims are obliged to pay a percentage, annually under Islamic law on certain kinds of property and use it for charitable and religious purposes. But in Bangladesh, using Zakat's money, people tend to purchase clothing and distribute those to the poor. This results in momentary happiness in the destitute family but doesn't bring much development in their lifestyles. To make appropriate use of Zakat money, we initiated to create a Sustainable Livelihood project titled **"Swanirbhor through Qard e Hasanah"**.

Background

This was first implemented by KKF in 2019 at a very small scale involving only three families to see its results. Considering its positive outcome, we held it a bit larger scale in 2020, helping **18 destitute** families. Since the pandemic strikes and people's income shrunken we observed the **18 families** with proper training and guidelines.







In the beginning it was limited with the farmers later on foundation decided to implement the program in two stream- for the farmers its Shufola and for other profession its Swanirbhor.

This project involves raising Zakat money and using it to create an income-generating source for destitute families. We give the breadwinner of the destitute families, a chance to become an entrepreneur and thus improve their own living standards.

As an NGO for the first time in the history of Bangladesh KKF has launched a program that was never implemented by any of the organizations before. This pandemic taught us in many ways.

The family who lost their everything during this pandemic their numbers are not very less. KKF launched an interest-free program named Swanirbhor under which it is going to help and provide people interest-free loan for sustainable livelihoods.

On the inaugural and launching day Chief Advisor Mr. Mahin Mazher, Senior Advisor Ms. Esha Mahin and Executive Director Ms. Sifat-E-Azam was present and distributed the money among the beneficiaries. The program officially started its journey from November 2021.



Health and Medical Care

Foundation also provided treatment for malnutrition, chronic illness, preventive care, maternity and reproductive health, free screenings and medications, basic health and sanitation, education, and much more. These health services you helped us to provide are a dream come true for people who lack access to safe water and sanitation and live in poor-quality slum housing, or no housing at all.

You also helped us to serve thousands, providing special medicines, dental kits, hygiene products sanitary napkins, to our health care programs those we provided numbers of remotest char of Bangladesh and deprived population.

Mental Health and Special Needs

To meet the demanding rise of depression, anxiety and an ever-increasing waitlist during this unforgiving pandemic, KKF quickly trained and hired qualified professional staff and shifted to virtual platforms, making services accessible to the growing number of person specially in need.

In addition to the web therapy sessions, the trainers coached people on how to manage mental health and family dynamics during the unfolding pandemic, and how to cope with anger and grief around this year's tragic accounts of systemic racism and police brutality. Orphanage and shelter house staff and children received trainings on how to support children/students stress related to academics and social isolation; community leaders received training on suicide prevention and other mental health matters.

KK Foundation successfully delivered over **1.6 million** food to the homes and hands of children, women and men; those homeless or in make-shift shacks, jobless or financially insecure; here at different parts of Bangladesh day after day, month after month from the start of the pandemic and still ongoing!



Hot Meals Year-Round

For last 3 years, we have been providing hot meals to malnourished and impoverished children and pandemic affected families of different affected parts of Bangladesh. Last year, we provided **2,26,665** (**approx**) meals in total. Because of your support, these well-nourished children now can focus in class and gain an education for a hopeful future under a safe shelter.

TECHNICAL TRAINING AND WORKSHOP

Fire Safety Training and Fire Drill

Foundation organized a day long training session on '*Fire Safety and Fire Drill*' as a part of its safety net program on June 14, 2021. Mr Saiful Islam, Bengal International Agency was the lead trainer of the program. Along with the basic fire safety lessons and fire drill he also enlightened participants about electric short-circuit, gas pipeline leakage and risks of cylinder gas. He also trained how to use fire extinguisher step by step. All the staffs and the children were trained under this program efficiently.



Technical Workshop on Creating Magazines

A workshop based on *creating magazine step by step* was organized on July 22, 2021. The workshop was conducted by Ms. Farhana Hasna Tuli, co-founder of Bookland Library and the moderator was Ms. Sifat-E-Azam, Executive Director, KKF.

All together eighteen participants joined the workshop. The main objective of the workshop was to develop the latent talents of the children and increase their reading and writing creativity. In the workshop how the magazine layout, content, design, naming and other things are prepared in a systematic manner were discussed in detail. At the end of the session certificates were given among the participants.

Workshop on Cartoon Making

On 18 June 2022 three children from Joy Shokol Shishur had participated a *cartoon workshop* organized by Bookland Library. Cartoonist Ahsan Habib conducted the cartoon workshop by himself and children learnt and enjoyed a lot through the workshop. At the end of the session children received certificates from Mr. Ahsan Habib.







Paramedic Training

KK Foundation organized a two-day long training session titled 'Paramedic- Emergency Medical Assistance' on December 07-08, 2021 in association with Katlamari Jewel-Kajol Memory Welfare Fund.

Twenty participants participated in the training session. The sessions were conducted by Dr. Shah Muhamad Sorif, MBBS, founder and chief advisor of Katlamari Jewel-Kajol Memory Welfare Fund, Mymensingh, Akhterujaman Sohel, Sub-Head Coordinator of the same organization, and Dr. Abdullah Al Muhit, Green Life Hospital. The sessions were the combination of both theory and practical lessons.

An evaluation were done through assessment and upon successful completion of that participants received the certificates.

VOCATIONAL TRAINING FOR UNDER PRIVILEGED TEEN

YOUTH AND ENTREPRENEURS' CAPACITY DEVELOPMENT

Training help the employees to allow employers to pinpoint the knowledge and skills that a particular organization looks for. This can educate employees about new skills or provide updates on existing skills to enhance productivity. Considering this in mind foundation has launched a new program specially designed for its staffs named Skill Up by Simple Learn. Under this program on a regular basis foundation is going to develop the skill of its employee as per need.

The following trainings were conducted under this program:

Introduction to MS Excel Training

Microsoft Excel is one of the common and popular features of Microsoft Office. In our daily professional life, this is one of the most essential applications to make professional life easier. Foundation jointly with Thought organized a two days long training on Microsoft Excel, "Introduction to MS Excel" under "Youths' and Entrepreneurs' Capacity/Skills Development Program" on dated 6-7 August 2021.

The facilitator Mr. Md. Golam Kausain Joarder, an experienced accountant professional conducted the session. The trainer teaches basic Ms Excel, how to create a cash book, salary sheet, stock sheet and basic formula of Ms Excel. At the end of the session certificates were given among the participants.





Workshop on Business Etiquette and Effective Communication

Etiquette is a basic skill of a successful business. The art of portraying a poised, self-confident image in today's demanding working atmosphere is a skill that is much too often overlooked by many professionals. A large part of the successful image comes from knowing your particular business, an even greater part comes from knowing the basics of good manners. Good manners include everything from building good relationships and being gracious in social situations to dressing appropriately for any business setting.

Every contact employee has with other people is a reflection on the organization. As organizations are more focused on competing in a global market, appropriate etiquette becomes increasingly important. In some instances, even an inappropriate introduction could cost an organization thousand in lost revenue as well as reputation.

Foundation under its 'skill up by simple learn' program has arranged a workshop for its employee on 21 May 2022. Ms. Rafia Sultana, Assistant Director, KK Foundation, facilitated the program. The workshop covers how to introduce people to others, using formal names instead of first names, when and how to thank others, how to dress with executive poise, proper social interaction



at receptions and parties, how and when to shake hands or greet others, navigating a formal table setting, handling meetings with ease, how to manage work space and appropriate interaction with co-workers.

Colleagues from both Development and Enterprise division has joined and enjoyed the session.





AWARENESS WORKSHOP

Social and Emotional Learning Workshop

Adolescents need social and emotional help. Every step of life they are learning new things like- how to handle new demands in school and social life, intense emotions (both positive and negative), and increasing feeling management that they need to be dealt without adult guidance. For the street children, this scenario is more challenging than others.

Social and emotional learning (SEL) programs of KKF are one way to help them navigate these difficulties. SEL programs try to help adolescents and distressed children to cope with their difficulties more successfully by improving skills and mindsets, and they try to create respectful surroundings and school environments that young people want to be a part.

In collaboration with Project Pothchola by Give Bangladesh on a regular basis foundation arranged workshop for the teen and adolescents for its Joy Shokol Shishur children. On 25th March 2022, Project Pothchola Team visited the program house and enlighten the children on self-awareness and self-management through an activity workshop.



Workshop on Menstrual Hygiene

World Menstrual Hygiene Day was observed on May 28 every year to break the taboos and end the stigma around menstruation. The day aims to raise awareness about the challenges regarding access to menstrual products, and education about menstruation and period-friendly sanitation facilities for all women. *"To create a world where no women or girl is held back because they menstruate, by 2030"* is the theme of the World Menstrual Hygiene Day 2022.

Though it was in May but Joy Shokol Shishur mentors organized a workshop on 28 May 2022 for the girls' children of the house. Ms. Emon and Ms. Aklima jointly moderated the workshop.





Workshop on Expressing Emotions

As a part of foundation's mental health awareness program jointly with project Pothchola foundation arranged a workshop for the shelter house children. The workshop topic was '*Expressing Emotions*' and it was held on 25th June 2022. Total *67* children participated in the workshop.

In this workshop, the focus was on helping participants learn to move through and release difficult emotions and cultivate skills for learning how to self-regulate going forward. This workshop is for the big feelers and over-thinkers to learn how to navigate and manage emotions instead of constantly trying to suppress or fight against them.

Participants were given tools to practice in a supportive environment, and given additional resources throughout the session. The purpose of the workshop was to help the participants in following special segments:

- Let go of painful stories
- Be present to one's feelings
- Reduce anxiety
- Move through resistance
- Stop overthinking
- Understand behavior and so on.

EVENTS AND ACTIVITIES

National Mourning Day 2021

National Mourning Day was observed as a public holiday in Bangladesh on August 15 across the country. To observe the National Mourning Day 2021 in a befitting manner, Shelter House organized five days long activities.

Child Rights Week 2021

Every year, child rights week is observed in KKF. This year the theme was "Invest for Children, Build Prosperous World (Shishur Jonno Biniyog Kori, Somriddho Bishwo Gori)". Considering the theme foundation has designed its program in such a manner so that children of Joy Shokol Shishur program enjoyed the week through interesting activities and learning.

August 15 Life story of the Bangabandhu Sheikh Muiibur Rahman was discussed through a workshop and posters and presentations were given by the children. Prizes are distributed among the children at the end through a ceremony.

Under the performance appraisal system, evaluations are carried out every four months. Review, Coordination and Planning

It provides the opportunity for the staff to interact and discuss issues relating to various departmental operations. The employees also discuss the organizational strategies and plans.

KKF Team

For operating the activities smoothly, the KKF programs, capacity development and knowledge management divisions of KKF have an excellent team of professionals having high proficiency. The regular core program group comprises well-coordinated and dedicated team members who manages the task effectively and efficiently.
